# Feeding the Homeless and Poor

Our distribution of food at Reading Minster continues to help up to ReadiStreet 70 people Tuesday to Friday evenings and Sunday afternoons. We have some fantastic volunteers a couple of whom are out virtually every night, others doing once a week or once a month.

We constantly need more volunteers to enable this work to continue safely and effectively. It is rewarding and challenging, so if you can offer even one evening a month, do contact Wendy on 0793 684 5301. As with all our work we need funding to enable it to happen.





Once again the night shelter was a great success, involving 10 host Churches in the town centre and over 300 volunteers.

The uptake from quests was less this year. Sadly in conversation with other charities and the Reading Borough Council the general feeling is that many prospective guests found the need to to stay out begging for money for drugs was too great a draw.

Nevertheless in all 33 quests were accommodated in January and February, Our partnership with St. Mungo's Street Services in Reading meant that 17 of our guests were found move on accommodation.

Bed for the Night is now seen by the Council as very much part of the regular provision for the homeless in the winter months. We only wish that we could extend to cover more months.

One guest commented on Facebook :- "hello, just a guick message for u because i would like to thank u for having me on b4n because if u did not then i would still be on the streets now and if it was not for the services i received from jan-feb then i would still be in the dark place i was then, the help and respect i got in that time was impeccable and i appreciate the help and quick thinking i received when i had the seizure (epileptic). Keep doing what u do because i am really appreciative of it "

What is particularly lovely about that post is that at the time he had been most uncooperative and unthankful to volunteers and paramedics, due to his confused state. So as we often say, the work is challenging but rewarding.



Many thanks again to Street Pastors for helping us with door security and a friendly hello to guests. Sadly for all at FAITH, Louise Cross our co-ordinator left to take up a full-time post elsewhere. We wish her every blessing in her new role.



Sharn Harvey has stepped into the role and, with her previous experience as a church co-ordinator, has taken up the reins very easily and effectively.

Stepping Stones was conceived as FAITH's response to the difficulty of housing people who have a history of homelessness. Over the years we have refined this down to only housing men who have been through Rehab and are in recovery, but still need considerable support in maintaining that recovery and working towards



independent living.



This year has seen us make a very difficult decision.

As I think we have made clear before, although we can obtain enhanced housing benefit, this does not cover the cost of our support worker.

**Kevin Derham** has worked with enormous compassion for the men in our care. He has had his fair share of success and challenge. He has learned much and grown enormously as a support worker. However, he has had to cover almost every aspect of supporting the residents and looking after the properties. So it was



By the early summer and with considerable sadness the trustees came to the conclusion that we need to hand over the running of the properties to others and free up the fund-raising burden to allow us to concentrate on other aspects of our work. We would like to thank anyone reading this who has specifically given to Stepping Stones. We currently have residents who are well looked after and supported and we are working on passing them on into safe hands.

ReadiFood The Food Bank has seen a further increase in levels of demand, going from an average of just over 100 parcels every week in 2016 to a stretching 145

per week. Some delivery rounds have become so large that they can no longer be done in one run, which creates a logistical challenge for Alison our Food Bank Manager.



We are constantly looking for more volunteers:- Drivers; Delivery Escorts; Sorters; Packers. Even 2

hours per week daytimes really would help. We have many retired people volunteering and

loving it.
