


We managed to complete the B4N Night Shelter all bar a couple of nights before lock-down 1 started and no-one caught COVID.




So we come to the end of a troubled year but with much to give God thanks for.

winter night shelter this year ran for 81 nights and we were able to provide meals and a bed to 37 guests, mainly men. We were joined this year by English Martyrs Church.



A Bed for the Night is now seen by the Council as very much part of the regular provision for rough sleepers and homeless in the winter months.



Sadly due to COVID we had to shut a couple of days early, but thanks to Council and Government funding all the guests were found accommodation in B & B's, a few being permanently housed straight away and others gradually over the months that followed.

Many thanks once again to **Street Pastors** for providing door security and a friendly welcome to guests.



We have also been able to keep Mary on in her role as a "**navigator**", supporting guests who had been with us in the shelter as they move on into accommodation and try to "normalise" their lives. This has branched out into a role of supporting people

who have "no recourse to public funds" (NRPF). Many of these are from Eastern Europe and came here for jobs which they have subsequently lost.

This ongoing new role has led to us re-instating the name "**Stepping Stones**" which was our housing project until a few years ago. Though we can't any longer actually house people we can assist and support them into housing.

Donation from The Hill School, Emmer Green

There have had to be big changes for ReadiFood this year due to Coronavirus and we've had to quite radically change the way we do things.

We started by reducing down the number of staff and volunteers in the building to lower risks. Then we've been putting each daily batch of food donations into quarantine.





Sadly demand has rocketed from around **180** per week to **250** putting pressure on both our packing teams and our delivery volunteers, not helped by having to wear masks or visors.

People have been incredibly generous and we have had **no shortage of food** donations, with many people coming to the warehouse to donate.

We have also enjoyed increased **donations** from **generous shoppers** at most of the **supermarkets** in town.

One area where we have struggled is that we have been unable to have corporate teams coming in to help sort, except in very small teams, and we have missed the fun of those days as much as the practical benefit they brought to us.
